Who is eLSi for?



How do I log on?


Go to the eLSi project website at www.elsi-project.eu and click on the link to training materials.

Then select either the in e-learning materials on e-Front or the resource library in Moodle.

You will receive an activation e-mail to your e-mail account, click on the link in this activation e-mail to verify your log details. You will now be free to use all the eLSi materials.

Choosing your courses




Once inside e-Front you will be presented with all the courses. Click on the blue downwards arrows to expand each country.



You can then click on each lesson that interests you and see the sub units within that lesson. For example below are the sub units for the lesson Business etiquette – Do's and Don'ts



You can either select just the material you want by clicking directly in the material box or you can click on the green arrow to play all the sub units.

Moodle

Logging on
